UP AND COMING CHARITY EVENTS

On Friday 24th February we would like everyone to come to school wearing blue; this is to raise awareness for a local charity the Ollie Young Foundation (OYF). Ollie Young was a Year One pupil at The Hawthorns Primary School in Woosehill who sadly died as a result of a brain tumour on the day before his 6th birthday. This year marks the 5th anniversary of Ollie's death; to date the charity has funded £225,000 towards paediatric brain tumour research (that's 9 years of expert research!) and £28,000 towards support. As the Ollie Young Foundation is 100% staffed by volunteers, a very high percentage of all money raised goes directly towards these causes. We would like to mark Ollie's anniversary and support the charity by holding a 'Wear Blue for Ollie' day; please can your children come to school wearing blue clothes – there will be buckets provided by OYF if you would like to make a donation.

We feel it is very important for the children in school to remember those less fortunate than themselves and to understand that we can make a difference to the lives of others, as part of our Fundamental British Values in school.

We will also be taking part in Red Nose Day 2017 on the 24th March for the first time; we would very much welcome your support and ideas! If you would like to help us raise money for this national charity please let me know.

E-SAFETY DAY

- Tell an adult you trust if something worries you

HEALTH MATTERS

We have had a number of cases of 'Slapped Cheek' this winter; this presents as a red rash on the cheeks. It is contagious before the rash appears; however, some children may feel rather unwell before the rash shows and can feel poorly for a few days. Please do not send your child to school if they are feeling unwell, but if they are in recovery and the rash is still present they can come to school if you think they are fit enough.

Please may I remind you that if your child experiences sickness and/or diarrhoea (for whatever reason) they must not come to school until at least 48 hours after their last bout of illness?

We have had several reported instances of headlice in school recently and would ask you all to make bug busting part of your weekly routine to try and stop the spread! If you want to review the procedure there is a useful leaflet on the website under Parents/Forms
