LOCKDOWN PRACTICE

The most important thing we do at school is to keep the children safe; it is now common for schools to practice 'Lockdown Procedures' to ensure we know how to keep children safe inside the school should the need occur. We will be having our first practice on Wednesday 11th October just after registration; this will not be a frightening experience for the children, it will be calm and very well organised. The children will be secured in one of the teaching areas they are familiar with for a short period of time so that myself and Mrs Prickett can check that they are all safe and out of sight. We will inform you after the event how things went.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

We have shortened the lunch hour to one hour in Year 1 which has had a very positive impact on learning and first aid! Year 2 now only have an hour for lunch on a Friday too. Year 1 have their lunch between 12:15 and 1:15 pm and Year 2 between 12:00 and 1:00 pm. Lunchtime clubs are organised to accommodate the changes. We now have a new team preparing and serving the school lunches and we are able to offer more choice; we now offer a baked potato each day with fresh salad, a vegetarian choice as well as a meat or fish choice. The children are also offered a variety of desserts including yoghurt and fresh fruit. If you are choosing to send your child to school with a packed lunch please ensure that it is a healthy lunch with no sweets or fizzy drinks. Please also remember that we are a nut free school.

SITE CONTROLLER AT WALTER INFANT SCHOOL

We are trying to recruit a new Site Controller for Walter Infant School, starting as soon as possible. We would like to have a colleague who can open the school each day at 7:00am and ensure that the site is safe, as well as taking delivery of our fruit and milk before the day begins. We are happy to be very flexible about hours; we will consider applicants who want to work part or full-time over 5 days. The role would be very varied, no day is ever the same at school, but would involve taking care of the school environment and making sure we are safe and compliant. We need someone who is capable at gardening, DIY, decorating and working with the public along with our dedicated team. It needs to be someone who doesn't mind getting their hands dirty on occasion and who is willing to attend training to work at height and conduct safety checks. GOVERNORS

Have you ever thought of becoming a school governor? We are looking for parent governors to join our governing body. Please see the flyer that has been sent out this week. It is a very rewarding role and would enable you to be involved in helping our school to continue to be a successful school and a happy place for children to learn.

TOYS ON FRIDAY

The children in Key Stage One (Year 1 and Year 2) are allowed to bring a toy in on a Friday to play with at playtime, lunchtime and during 'Friday Fun' in the afternoon if they would like to. Please do not bring hand-held electronic devices or anything requiring batteries. We have limited storage space, so please don't send in anything too big. The children will be responsible for their own toys; we will endeavour to make sure they are well looked after, but we cannot guarantee that things will not be lost or broken.

PARKING AND IDLING CARS

It has been brought to my attention by a number of parents, grandparents and residents that parking around school has become very dangerous and inconsiderate. Last month a car was spotted parked diagonally across the corner of the junction for Murray Road and Oxford Road, making many people late to school and to work. You will see from the photograph below that parents have been parking on the double yellow lines in St Paul's Gate as well as across driveways preventing residents access and egress to and from their properties. We now have a new Police Community Support Worker (PCSO) who will be regularly patrolling the area at the beginning and end of the school day. Wokingham Borough Council has responsibility for civil parking enforcement; details of this can be viewed on their website.



There have also been concerns raised by parents and local residents about parked cars 'idling'; which means parked with the engine still running. An idling engine can produce up to twice as many exhaust emissions as an engine in motion. Exhaust emissions contain a range of air pollutants such as carbon monoxide and nitrogen dioxide which can affect the air quality of the surrounding environment and the air we breathe; one parent noted that a child had commented on the smell and the smoke from the parked car as they passed the vehicle.

PARENT CONSULTATIONS AND OPEN EVENINGS

Some of our parents shared that they felt we had held our consultation meetings too early last year so we will now be holding them a little later in the term; on Monday 6th November from 3:30 pm until 6:00 pm and Wednesday 8th November from 4:00 pm until 7:00 pm. The parents of children in our Robin classes will have open evenings on Monday 6th November 4:00 pm until 5:50 pm and Wednesday 8th November 5:30 pm until 7:00 pm. We will provide more information closer to the time. If you have a child who is on our Special Educational Needs register, Mrs Ambler our Inclusion Manager, will be available on Wednesday 8th November.

Please remember that we have an 'Open Door' Policy to meet with parents as the need arises; all our class teachers are available at the end of everyday if you wish to speak with them. It is also possible to arrange an appointment if you feel you need to have a private, more formal discussion.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Some parents have had difficulties contacting Gooddies by email; the admin team at school are liaising with Gooddies to try to understand what the issues are with correspondence, such as no replies within 48 hours, so we would welcome your feedback. Unfortunately we are not able to contact them directly on behalf of a customer, but we do need to monitor the efficiency of the service. Some parents have posted on Social Media sites that they are unhappy with the quality; we met with a number of uniform providers and considered Gooddies to be the best quality and value for money available. Gooddies also provide the uniform for St. Paul's Junior School and other local schools. We would also very much appreciate any feedback (negative or positive) on the quality of the uniform you have received. Some parents have asked why we have changed our procedures: this is because we no longer have the funds to buy uniform in advance and hold it in stock, so like most other local schools have gone down the online purchasing route. Hopefully things will become smoother in the next few weeks.

IS YOUR CHILD ELIGIBLE FOR THE PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT?

Pupil Premium Funding is an extremely valuable resource for our school and can hugely benefit the children who qualify for the grant and many other children too as we can use it to fund classroom support and resources.

If your family circumstances have changed recently, such as a loss of or change to your employment or sadly a relationship breakdown leading to sole parenting, you may be entitled to the funding. The identities of the families who qualify for the grant are protected.

If you qualify for any of the benefits below, the school (through the local authority) may be able to claim additional funding to support your child's education. This funding is very beneficial for your children and the school as a whole. If you wish to register please call at the School Office for a form or download one from the website.

To be eligible at least one parent must be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal credit
- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190.
- The Guarantee element of the State Pension Credit

We use the funding for many things, including a free extra-curricular club for every PPG child; we can also use it to supplement school trips and even uniform, when a need has been identified. We do understand that no money actually comes into the household, but the benefits to the school and are children are huge.

SCHOOL CLUBS and SCHOOL UNIFORM

We have changed our system for booking extra-curricular clubs; from now on the clubs will be bookable on line on a 'first come first served' basis. The place in each club will be secured by the online payment, through our online cash office Tucasi, using Scopay.



As you will know from our recent correspondence; we have changed our school uniform provider; after very careful consideration our uniform will now be provided by Gooddies; it will be available to purchase online to have a home delivery or to be delivered to the school for collection. We still have some very small jumpers and polo shirts available at a reduced price and some very large ones! Please ask in the school office if you are interested. Please be aware that we will only be holding a stock of book bags from now on. We hope that you are all pleased with the quality of the new uniform; I particularly like the new book bags.

HEALTH MATTERS

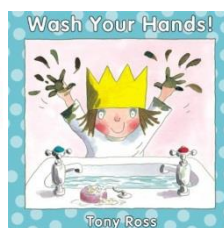
If your child receives a head injury or a bump to the head at home, please could you inform the school so that we can take care to monitor them in school throughout the day.

May I remind you that if your child has suffered from sickness or diarrhoea that they remain absent from school for 48 hours after their last episode of illness.
