We also had our first chocolate tombola, organised by our school council members; we raised **£362.50** which was wonderful and the children felt so proud of themselves. Thank you to everyone who donated chocolate and we would like to apologise to those of you who were unable to buy tickets. We were delighted to receive chocolate donations from four local supermarkets and would like to thank them also (our school councillors have written directly to the stores to let them know how much money was raised). We have been able to add another red block to our school thermometer!



We would also like to say a huge thank you to one of our families who made a very generous donation of £400 to the school funds; they would like to remain anonymous and we are extremely grateful. We

will be using the money to develop and improve the learning environment inside the school so that as many children as possible can benefit.

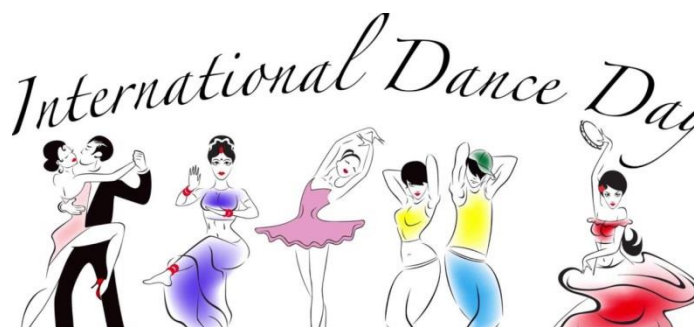


## INTERNATIONAL DANCE DAY
