Short Breaks Consultation Update

A very lively and productive session took place on Wednesday 8th March when parents were presented with the proposed changes to the short break provision. Paul Feven (Interim Head of strategic commissioning) explained the background to the proposed changes which were the result of an in-depth commissioning review of the current offering from 18 providers both internal and from the Voluntary and Community Sector. Nicky Hale (Interim Service Manager, Corporate Parenting and Learning Disabilities & Difficulties) outlined proposed changes to the current system which will offer parents a pre-paid card to eliminate the burden of paperwork and receipts. A new short breaks "preferred provider list" of WBC quality assured services will be developed for parents to choose from. The overall aim is to provide parents with more choice and create a more direct relationship between them and the provider. Parents were then invited to break into groups to put forward their views to a number of key questions, regarding the proposed changes, their views on current gaps in provision and their feelings regarding being involved in the selection of providers. This information will now be evaluated and the results fed back to parents within the next 8 weeks.
