In Key Stage 1, every child had one vote, so they had to think very carefully about how to use it. In Foundation Stage 2, every member of staff had one vote, they too had to think very carefully about the most suitable representative for their class.

This is how we help our children to learn about democracy:

DEMOCRACY

We will help our children to:

- Understand that they can be part of some of the decisions made in school
- Know they have a voice and the right to be heard
- Elect members of the school council through a democratic process
- Debate and agree a code of conduct for their class

These 15 children are the successful candidates; Well done all of you.



The meeting we held was very successful, Mrs Prickett and I were so impressed by the children's contrinutions and opinions. This is what the children have come up with.

They do not like rough play, fighting or arguments at playtimes. I have already addressed these concerns with all staff members. The children need to feel safe at all times in school and rough play can quickly become dangerous. Please help us by discouraging rough play at home.

They would like to help the school raise money for our new reading garden and more toys!


- Raising money for new toys for the classrooms

Pupil Premium Funding

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one sessions, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.

3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.

4) Child Tax Credit - Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.

5) Guarantee Pension Credit.

6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

7) Universal Credit.
