Head Lice are back in School!



Head lice spread very quickly between young children as they play so closely together. Some of you will never have come across headlice before as your children have started school for the first time. The eggs (nits) of the lice stick themselves to the hair shaft close to the head:



They are not as easy to see in fair hair.

They hatch very quickly:



They are parasites, piercing the skin and feeding off your child's blood. They are very itchy and unpleasant and can quickly become infected if your child scratches the bites.

Please do not send your child to school with headlice or nits with treatment. If we see headlice on your child we will contact you, request that you collect your child, treat them and then bring them back to school. We do recognise that this is not always possible; especially for working parents a distance away. Wet combing with conditioner is one of the cheapest and most effective ways. Once a head louse has been broken it immediately dies.

The Cost of Living Crisis

As we all begin to navigate the Cost of Living Crisis I thought I would share with you some research I have done about the support that could be available for all households from the Government:



If you follow the link at the top you may be able to find additional support for your families.

Pupil Premium Funding

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one sessions, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
