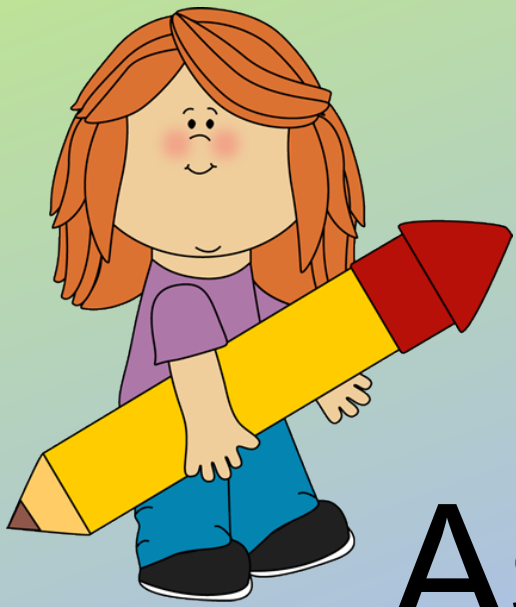

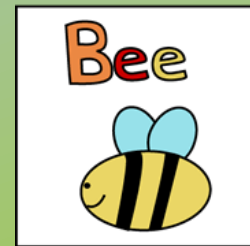
As writers we are making

Monday - planning

This week you are going to make your own comic strip. You will need to create your own superhero based on Supertato, for example Supercarrot, Superbroccoli or Superonion etc. If you have any vegetables at home you could even create a real version of your superhero. You will also need to create a villain and a dilemma. A dilemma is a problem that the villain has caused, perhaps your villain is trying to put all the fruits into a blender, trying to bake all the peppers or throwing all the vegetables into the food waste bin.
