


Facts!

Today you are going to write some facts about yourself using statement sentences. What could you write about yourself?

Statements are the most common type of sentence. They tell the reader a fact or idea about a single topic. They must always end in punctuation, usually a full stop.

Statement

A statement is a telling sentence. It tells the reader something.

An example of a statement:

The ship sailed across the ocean.



A statement starts with a capital letter and ends with a period.

What facts could you share?

How old are you?

What month of the year were you born? What is your favourite colour?

What do you like to eat?

Do you have any hobbies?

What colour is your hair?

Can you think of any other exciting pieces of information you can share?




Activities/Resources


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




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





















































Adding Coins

What amount is in each money jar? Add or combine the values together, start with the largest number or value coin.




Adding Coins
