The Manager from the Foodbank has requested specific items that they are very low on at the moment.

- Shampoo
- All-purpose cleaner
- Washing power and washing gel packs (small boxes only)
- Washing up liquid
- Toilet rolls

Please DO NOT donate Baked Beans, pasta or tea as they have an abundance!

#### **Head Bumps**

It is our policy to telephone all parents if a child bumps their head this is because a fracture may have no symptoms and a concussion or compression may develop slowly. If your child is unfortunate and bumps the skull area of their head (not chins and cheeks) we will telephone you to explain the incident. If we are concerned we will ask for a parent or guardian to attend school to decide if a child is well enough to remain. If a child were to have a head injury that required immediate help we would call 999. You will usually receive a call from the first aider who has dealt with the incident as they will have the most information. You will be required to sign a slip stating that you have been informed when you collect your child from school. If your child is going to an after school club, the club leader will sign as they will then be responsible for your children. We will monitor all head bumps carefully in school. Thank you for your understanding.

# From Robin, Woodpecker, Dove and Magpie Classes!

We have fewer children in our Foundation Stage claiming the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) Funding for their child than recent years; if you are in receipt of Universal Credit or other benefits your child may be entitled to Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) Funding..... please read on!

### Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)

On Wednesday I went to a Pupil Premium Conference in London and I left there confident that the staff at Walter Infant School and Nursery are doing a fantastic job for ALL our children. Yesterday we had the Whole School Census which determines whether our school budget will reduce due to pupil numbers. We had 8 fewer children registered for Pupil Premium Funding: we use this money in many ways to

benefit our children, such as school clubs, Canine Assisted Learning, our Family Support Worker, resources for the classrooms, school trips, school uniform, additional staff hours, and the list goes on. If you think your family could be eligible, please read on.

#### What is it?

Pupil Premium funding was introduced in 2011; it is a sum of money (£1320) given to the school, for any child who qualifies for Free School Meals or for any child who was eligible for free school meals from Reception to Year 6. Pupil Premium funding lasts for 6 years of a child's school life from the date it begins.

Do you have an income that is less than...



Or are you in receipt of any of the benefits below?

Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)

- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

These benefits have now been rolled into a single benefit, called Universal Credit.

Universal Credit is being rolled out, with an expected completion date of March 2022. All pupils who were eligible for free school meals up to April 2018 will continue to receive free school meals during this period.
