Home Schooling

We have placed lots more resources for each year group on the website for Mathematics and English; these have been planned by your children's teachers with home schooling in mind, they should be really good fun and easy to teach. There are also many more stories and activities to keep everyone busy and interested but.....

I am very aware that home schooling is anything but easy; it has been reported that 20% of families are not engaging in home schooling, and do you know what, that is okay. It can cause huge amounts of stress, parent and teacher roles have been blurred and as many adults know, working at home is very different from being in the workplace, and likewise classroom.

School is not just about reading, writing and arithmetic; I have just completed a report for our school governors on the attainment of your children since the school year began and I am delighted to report that each and everyone of your children has made good or better progress since September. All our staff are well-prepared to ensure that your children will receive all the experiences they need to close any gaps that may appear and to re-teach key concepts and strategies when the time comes.

When your children are at school they learn many new skills in a variety of different ways: they learn to

- Draw, cut, colour, paint, join different materials together by making collages or junk modelling
- Construct using Lego, Duplo, K'nex, Stickle Bricks, building blocks and bricks; building tall towers, ramps, farms, zoos, play parks etc
- Climb, run, hop, skip, catch and throw, balance, roll, play games such as football, tennis, cricket
- Measure capacity with buckets and jugs, sand and water
- Weigh things and balance objects
- Listen to stories, make up stories and plays or puppet shows
- Make their own music using body percussion, clapping, tapping, clicking, stamping, we make instruments with containers, rice, boxes and elastic bands
- Solve problems: how many small bricks will fill this box, will this one hold more or less?
- Use a computer programme (visit Education City or Purple Mash)
- Identify animals and their babies
- Plan healthy meals and sort food into different categories
- Bake cakes, design sandwiches, make milk shakes or smoothies
- Sew making glove puppets or clothing for toys
- Look at different plants and try to identify them, comparing the shapes of different leaves
- Make repeating patterns using beads or blocks or felt tip pens
- Play board games and jigsaw puzzles
- And sometimes we watch tv clips and videos to help us learn new things

On our website there is a guide to handwriting, helping to learn how to form the letters correctly, this will be fun for adults and children alike; writing words they have learned from their phonics on Phonics Play.
