

Exposure to COVID-19 The virus is spread in minute water droplets that are expelled from the body through sneezing, coughing, talking and breathing. The virus can be transferred to the hands and from there to surfaces. It can survive on surfaces for a period after transfer (depending on such things as the surface type, its moisture content and temperature).	Everyone on site. General transmission may occur: Through close contact between colleagues, pupils and visitors and touching contaminated surfaces	 Anyone feeling unwell with COVID 19 symptoms or has someone in their household who is unwell informed not to attend school until they have a negative PCR test or have isolated to 10 days. Frequent handwashing regimes in place especially before snack and lunch Vigilance before eating with handwashing, increased handwashing posters Hand sanitiser available in classrooms and shared spaces at access and egress points. Frequent cleaning of surfaces that pupils touch especially during break times Children taught to "Catch-it, Bin-it, Kill-it" Children taught to sneeze or cough into their elbows Bins for tissues emptied during the day into black bags and then placed in the outside bins: The external bins are emptied on a Monday so 72 hours will pass before collection Staff, parents and visitors informed of the measures in place to reduce transmission. Increased number of COVID 19 cases in school	All adults and children	 Mrs Fiona Prickett is our appointed Covid 19 Coordinator We are encouraging all members of staff to take twice weekly lateral flow tests and to report to school and Gov.UK PCR tests for staff following a positive test result for a child or close contact If a household member has Covid 19 confirmed by a PCR test; anyone attending school must LFD test for 7 days having 7 consecutive negative results. Anyone choosing not to LFD test must isolate for 7 days. If a child or staff member has a positive PCR they must isolate and not return to school until the 10 day deadline, agreed with Test and Trace and confirmed by school. Early on in the pandemic, the NHS promoted awareness of three main symptoms of COVID-19, sometimes referred to as the 'classic triad':

- Persistent cough
- High temperature (fever)
- Loss of smell (anosmia)

Now there are six clusters of symptoms of COVID 19 which are as are as follows:

- 1 ('flu-like' with no fever): Headache, loss of smell, muscle pains, cough, sore throat, chest pain, no fever.
- 2 ('flu-like' with fever): Headache, loss of smell, cough, sore throat, hoarseness, fever, loss of appetite.
- 3 (gastrointestinal): Headache, loss of smell, loss of appetite, diarrhea, sore throat, chest pain, no cough.
- 4 (severe level one, fatigue): Headache, loss of smell, cough, fever, hoarseness, chest pain, fatigue.
- 5 (severe level two, confusion): Headache, loss of smell, loss of appetite, cough, fever, hoarseness, sore throat, chest pain, fatigue, confusion, muscle pain.
- 6 (severe level three, abdominal and respiratory): Headache, loss of smell, loss of appetite, cough, fever, hoarseness, sore throat, chest pain, fatigue, confusion, muscle pain, shortness of breath, diarrhea, abdominal pain.
