


Dear Walter Families,

#### Parking Problems at School

As you are aware, we are continuing to have parking issues at the start and the end of the school day. This is because there are three educational settings trying to receive well over 700 children at the same time. On Monday there was a great deal of beeping and honking horns, which was extremely frightening for some of the children. I watched as cars did multi-point turns in the road, others drove onto the pavements, turned around in the West Oak entrance and stopped on the pelican crossing! I was so concerned that I positioned myself next to the road so that I could see exactly what was happening in order to keep the children safe.

Children do not have the conceptual skills to cross a road until they are ten years old as there are so many risks to consider. Therefore, we all have a duty of care to keep our children safe. I would like everyone to follow the same rules to make our school much safer:

- Please walk, cycle or scoot to school if you can
- Please park away from the school and walk the last few hundred metres if possible
- Please do not park on private property such as Murray House or West Oak
- Please do not park at the school gates on Oxford Road
- Please do not obscure the pelican crossing or the zig zag lines
- Please put the safety of our children before everything else.
- If you do park near to the school please ensure you turn your engines off.



#### Snacks at the end of the school day!



#### Covid 19 Update



Cases of Covid 19 (Coronavirus) are rising rapidly nationally and very specifically in Wokingham; there is a considerable amount of confusion about the new rules and regulations with regard to positive test results from a PCR.

As Headteacher, with the requirement to keep everyone as safe as possible, I am following the direction of other schools and making the decision that if there is a positive Covid 19 PCR test result for a person living in the same house as a pupil or a member of staff that no one from the house can come to school even if they tested negative.

It has been recommended that the household members test on day 3 to day 5 after the positive test result has been received. If they still test negative they can return to school if they do not have any symptoms of Covid 19 (including cluster symptoms).

Early on in the pandemic, the NHS promoted awareness of three main symptoms of COVID-19, sometimes referred to as the 'classic triad':

- Persistent cough
- High temperature (fever) 37.8C or greater
- Loss of smell (anosmia)

Now there are six clusters of symptoms of COVID 19 which are as are as follows:

**1** ('flu-like' with no fever): Headache, loss of smell, muscle pains, cough, sore throat, chest pain, no fever.

2 ('flu-like' with fever): Headache, loss of smell, cough, sore throat, hoarseness, fever, loss of appetite.

**3 (gastrointestinal):** Headache, loss of smell, loss of appetite, **diarrhoea**, sore throat, chest pain, no cough.

**4 (severe level one, fatigue):** Headache, loss of smell, cough, fever, hoarseness, chest pain, **fatigue**.

**5 (severe level two, confusion):** Headache, loss of smell, loss of appetite, cough, fever, hoarseness, sore throat, chest pain, fatigue, **confusion**, muscle pain.

**6 (severe level three, abdominal and respiratory):** Headache, loss of smell, loss of appetite, cough, fever, hoarseness, sore throat, chest pain, fatigue, confusion, muscle pain, **shortness of breath, diarrhoea, abdominal pain.**

# Helping our Friends and Neighbours

As you will be very aware, the Government have stopped the additional payment of £20 to the most vulnerable of families on Universal Credit ~ this means that families in our community will be £1000 a year worse off as we move into the most expensive season of the year.

Our vulnerable children will need hot meals, warm clothing and bedding, hot water and heating. Many families will need to decide if they are "heating or eating". More than 10% of our community rely on benefits to provide all they need for their children.

If you would like to help and can afford to without causing personal financial difficulties for yourselves, I would like to politely ask for a donation of twenty pounds in cash (or a lesser amount), anonymously given to the office staff at Walter, to be put into a fund to help our parents who are facing such difficult times.

We will be opening our new **Walter's Pantry** to help our families in need due the significant cuts to their benefits (as mentioned above). The staff team of Walter Infant School and Nursery have set up a pantry of breakfast and tea staples to help out families who may be struggling to put food on the table and money in the meter. If you are one of those families and need a helping hand, from Monday 11<sup>th</sup> October you will be able to collect cereal and tinned foods so that you can provide breakfast and lunch for your family when there is nowhere else to turn. We will keep all requests completely confidential and you will be able to arrange a private collection time during the school day if you wish. I know many of you will want to donate but we are limited by space so we will manage the groceries in house. You will be able to make donations to the Foodbank during our harvest festival week in November.

#### **Pupil Premium Funding**

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one sessions, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
