Head Lice

Talking of hair: some children have been arriving in school with head lice and/or nits; as you know head lice travel from head to head and they particularly enjoy freshly washed hair! Head lice is not a sign of poor hygiene or grooming, but it is a nuisance, spreads rapidly and can cause great discomfort for your children. If your child has only just started school you may never have seen them before: this is what nits look like in your child's hair:





Head lice are parasites and live on blood! They can live for 30 days and lay 6 eggs a day! They can make you very itchy and uncomfortable; the bites turn in to sores and can become infected. If everyone checks tonight we could be a nit and lice free school by Monday!

Changes in Circumstances

Sometimes you may have a change at home; you may consider it to be a small change, like a visitor coming to stay or someone going away for a while. Sadly you might have lost a pet, or someone could be ill; these things can have a very big impact on your very young children, so please let us know. You can speak to me or Mrs Prickett in the morning, email me or speak to Mrs Janes or Mrs Hemmings in the office, either in person or on the telephone. We will always be confidential. Please don't think your children don't notice if you are sad or unwell, or missing someone. They notice that you behave differently so they need to try to understand the changes; or otherwise they will worry and come to the wrong conclusions by filling in the gaps in their own way. They might think you are sad because you don't like them anymore! They might hear you mention a doctors or a hospital appointment on the phone or to another adult and become very worried. It is important to 'share and prepare' at an age appropriate level. Such as, 'Mummy has a sore tummy and the doctor is going to help to make it better.' Or, 'I am going away for work for a few days but I will be back in 4 sleeps' and then let us know so we can help.

Flooding by the Robin Entrance Gate

During this very wet weather we can experience flooding on the path to Robin from the Oxford Road gate; if this happens we will not open the gate so please come through the gate on Murray Road into the playground. Thank you.

Parking at West Oak Care Home

Pupil Premium Funding

What is it?

Pupil Premium funding was introduced in 2011; it is a sum of money (£1320) given to the school, for any child who qualifies for Free School Meals or for any child who was eligible for free school meals from Reception to Year 6. Pupil Premium funding lasts for 6 years of a child's school life from the date it begins.

Do you have an income that is less than...

£16, 190!

Or are you in receipt of any of the benefits below?

Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)

- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

These benefits have now been rolled into a single benefit, called Universal Credit.

Universal Credit is being rolled out, with an expected completion date of March 2022. All pupils who were eligible for free school meals up to April 2018 will continue to receive free school meals during this period. We use the money to provide extra-curricular clubs, additional adult support and resources. We can use it to help with school uniform including coats and shoes.
