#### **Screen Time for Children**

You may have read in the press or online, or watched on the news yesterday and today that there are recommendations for screen time for children.

# What does the guidance recommend parents do?

There are several clear steps for parents, which the chief medical officers say will help keep children safe and healthy.

These include:

- not using phones and mobile devices at the dinner table talking as a family is very important for development
- keeping screens out of the bedroom at bedtime
- talking as a family about keeping safe online and about cyber-bulling and what children should do if they are worried
- not using phones when crossing a road or doing any other activity that requires a person's full attention
- making sure children take a break from screens every two hours by getting up and being active
- policing their own use too parents should give their children proper attention and quality family time and never assume they are happy for pictures to be shared

If you would like your child to attend regularly (even if only once a week) it costs £5.50 per session (from 7:30 am until the start of the school day). We ask that you provide breakfast or a snack



# **Punctuality at the start of the School Day**

Some children regularly arrive late for school. We recognise that traffic can impact on journeys occasionally but we are concerned about the children who are late every day. The school opens its doors to Key Stage 1 at 8:40 am and closes them at 8:50 am. Foundation Stage 2 starts at 8:45 am and the gates are closed at 8:50 am. In Robin the day starts at 8:30 am. Being late for school has a big impact on the start of the day; some children are missing their Sensory Circuits classes, others miss playing games and completing activities in the class rooms, as well as the time to change their reading books and choose their lunch.

The Education Welfare Service for Wokingham Borough Council states:

It is crucial that pupils arrive at school on time for registration at the beginning of the day. Lateness into school causes disruption to that individual's learning and to that of other pupils in the class. It is paramount therefore that all pupils arrive at school on time.

Registration takes place at 8.50 am and pupils who arrive after that time will be recorded as late to school.

Any child arriving at school after 9.10 am will have the lateness recorded as an unauthorised absence.

Persistent lateness by a pupil will initially be followed up by school staff and if not resolved, will be referred to the Education Welfare Service.

# **Pupil Premium Funding**

Some of our families will be in receipt of benefits that mean that their child/ren are entitled to a grant to enhance their education within school; we use this money for a variety of opportunities, such as an extra-curricular club, school uniform, help towards the contribution for school trips or perhaps, additional support with teaching and learning. If you think you child could be entitled to this 'in-School' funding; please collect an application form from the school office.

# Who is entitled to Pupil Premium Funding?

To be eligible at least one parent must be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal credit
- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190.
- The Guarantee element of the State Pension Credit

#### Or:

- At least one parent was eligible for any of the above benefits in the last six years
- Children who are or have been looked after under local authority care
- Children from service families who receive a child pension from the Ministry of Defence.
