Dear Walter Families,

Well, for some of our families, today is the last day of their first half term at Walter Infant School and Nursery; we hope you have enjoyed becoming part of our wonderful, happy community. This has been an 8 week half term; many schools are already on their half term break, so I commend you all for making it to the end, children, staff and parents! The children are exhausted, but still remain as hardworking and resilient as ever. We look forward to seeing you all on Tuesday 5th November which is the first day of the next term. The school is closed on Monday 4th November for staff training.

Information from OFSTED

I am delighted to inform you that the most recent information that we have received from OFSTED about our school is our Primary Inspection Data Summary Report. In our report it states that in KS1 we are significantly above national in reading and mathematics and we are in the highest 20% of all schools for 2017, 2018 and 2019. In writing we are significantly above national and we are in the highest 20% of all schools for 2018 and 2019.

In Foundation Stage, the percentage (84%) of children achieving a Good Level of Development was significantly higher than national and we are in the highest 20% of all schools for 2018. In 2019 we had 92% of children so I am anticipated similarly good news. I am so proud of all the Walter Infant School and Nursery children and staff. There have been many changes at school since I joined the school in September 2015 and now we are really starting to see the impact of those changes. We have fully committed and dedicated team devoted to ensuring that your children have the best possible experience and achieve as well as they can. Well done everyone.



Values

We presented more values badges to the children who have displayed our values through their behaviours; today we have given our first ever Robin Values Badge to Mabel! Miss Potter explained that Mabel demonstrated all our behaviour and Mabel told me that she has kind hands.







Parent Consultations

I am so sorry I missed our Parent Consultations this week; I have been told that there was a very cheerful atmosphere in the school. I asked the children this morning in assembly if their parents were proud of them and 270 hands went up; so that was wonderful. If you have not yet had a chance to meet with your child's teacher, please approach them at the end of the day to make an appointment. We do hope for 100% attendance.

Attendance

We have noticed that a large number of children are arriving after the register is closed. We expect all our children to be in school by 8:50 am when we close all our doors to school. As a result of the increasing numbers, we are going to introduce a signing in system where parents will be asked to register their children at the office with an arrival time and the reason for lateness. This is the information we have been advised to send out by the Educational Welfare Officer:

It is the parent's responsibility to ensure pupils arrive at school on time and is in his/her class by 8.50am. Failure to do will result in your child missing an important part of the school day when information is shared with pupils during registration.

If your child is late for school we have to record the following codes:

- Code L Late arrival before the register has closed (8.50am)
- Code U Late arrival after the register has closed (9.20am) (Schools should actively discourage late arrival, be alert to patterns of late arrival and seek an explanation from the parent.)

It could also mean that your child fails to achieve 100% attendance even if they do come into school every day.

I recognise that the traffic and parking restrictions can cause some delays but this is not a valid reason for being late each day. Thank you for your understanding with this matter; good attendance is vital for our school as it is recorded and compared to other school's locally and nationally.
