We have been directed to keep a log of any absences related to COVID 19 and it shows us that our parents are being very vigilant and supporting us to keep our community safe; thank you so much.

Please remember not to send your child to school if they have:

- a new, persistent cough
- a high temperature (37.8 or above)
- loss of taste and/or smell

You could have all or just one of these symptoms

Please:

- wash your hands regularly
- use anti-bacterial hand gel
- wear a mask to and from school and on the school site (not children or if you are exempt)
- please socially distance
- please leave our site as soon as you can
- do not meet anyone outside of your household/support bubble (unless 1:1 socially distancing)
- do not have visitors into your home

Head Lice

Sadly, COVID 19 is not the only persistent critter around; we have had a number of cases of head lice. Please check your child's hair daily. If you spot eggs (nits) or lice, wash your child's hair and then slather the hair with any sort of hair conditioner. Using a 'nit' comb; comb through every strand of hair. This should remove most of the eggs and the egg cases from the scalp and the lice. Head lice cannot survive an injury, so a 'nit' comb is your best piece of equipment. Nit combing dry hair can be very unpleasant so the conditioner makes it much easier and slippier!


