COVID 19 update for this week

We sent a useful letter out from the NHS this week; it detailed exactly what to do if you suspect that your child is unwell with COVID 19 symptoms.

- You should only book a test if your child has any of these three coronavirus symptoms:
 - a high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)
 - 2. a new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
 - 3. a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal
- Your child does not need a test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.
 - If you are unsure about whether to get a test, please check the official list of symptoms on the NHS website, which is reviewed regularly: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/

Attached to our flyer this week we have a list of what you should do if you have any concerns about the health of your family. I hope you will all find it useful.

Pupil Premium Funding

If you experiencing financial hard ship please get in touch with us; we may be able to help. If you have had a change to your circumstances, your child may be entitled to Pupil Premium Funding? If you contact Mrs Janes or Mrs Hemmings in the office they will be able to send you a form to complete.

You may be able to claim if you are in receipt of:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

The Pupil Premium for 2020 to 2021 will include pupils recorded in the January 2020 school census who are known to have been eligible for FSM since May 2014, as well as those first known to be eligible in January 2020.

Please also remember that we can help you to get food parcels from Wokingham Food Bank so please speak in confidence to the staff in the school office on admin@walter.wokingham.sch.uk or 01189780825.
